






5.1 Active providers as at 30 September 2019 by entity type



3.2 Total annualised committed supports for active participants with an approved plan by primary disability (%)




3.4 Total annualised committed supports for active participants with a function score and an approved plan by level of function (%)





6.6 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by primary disability for age 0 - 6 yrs










6.13 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 7 to 14 yrs





6.14 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by primary








6.21 Distribution of active participants with an approved plan by level of function for age 15 to 24 yrs




